Puppies have a very specific socialisation period when they are much more accepting of new environments and experiences, but for most puppies this period closes at only 16 weeks! That means it's absolutely critical to be proactive about providing your puppy with positive exposure to lots of different things (it's not just dogs and people) during these 16 weeks.
